

## **COVID-19 ACADEMIC EXPECTATIONS**

## **EXPECTATIONS OF ALL STUDENTS**

- Whether remote or in person, all students are expected to attend their regularly scheduled classes and comply with all expectations outlined in the 2020-2021 Student Handbook.
- All students are expected to satisfy the educational expectations outlined by their specific teachers. These expectations are found in course syllabi and are communicated by individual teachers.
- All students will actively engage with important information they receive each day, including:
  - 1. Checking their school email regularly
  - 2. Reviewing information posted to Google Classroom

## **IN-PERSON EXPECTATIONS**

• When on campus, all students must comply with all health and safety regulations pertaining to COVID-19. These expectations can be found in the Student Handbook: "Addendum: Covid-19 Policies".

## REMOTE EXPECTATIONS

- All students are expected to attend their entire class meeting, seated in an appropriate work area and wearing a PF uniform shirt.
- Students will follow their regularly scheduled classes, utilizing the class meeting links posted by the teacher and in accordance with their academic schedule.
- Students must have their laptop camera on throughout their class; if a student's camera is not working, a parent must email the appropriate teachers.
- No class material will be recorded without the explicit permission of the teacher.
- Students will be engaged and ready to participate, using the chat feature and/or the microphone on their device, at the direction of the teacher.
- Students should not have anything distracting in the background.
- Classroom decorum observed, for example: no food/lunch breaks during class.
- Teachers may require Google docs to make sure students are doing work in real time, especially for online quizzes and the like.
- Academic honesty is still expected of students at all times.
- Students should mute themselves unless otherwise directed by their teacher in order to minimize background noise.
